I was delighted to receive \$4,500 from the Barrett Family Foundation Leadership Scholarship for being one of the top ten students in academic performance during my fourth year. During my second and third year, I received \$2,000 annually.

As part of my program, I interned with Copernicus Educational Products. Later, I joined the team as a junior industrial designer and now I am working full-time with the organization as an industrial designer. I also set up my graphic design company named Rabbit Design Studio. It is hard to do two jobs along with studies at the same time. But it is totally worth it.

As an international student you may be eligible to work on and/or off campus during regular school sessions. You may also be eligible to work full time during scheduled breaks, such as the winter and summer holidays or reading week.

WORKING ON CAMPUS

Working on campus will help you gain valuable work experience, learn about services at Humber and earn extra money. Most positions offer flexibility to accommodate your study schedule.

WORKING OFF CAMPUS

Working off campus is a great opportunity to gain first-hand experience within a Canadian company and work environment. You must have a valid study permit that states you are eligible to work off campus.

POST-GRADUATION WORK PERMIT

If you are in an academic program of eight months or more, you may be eligible to apply for a Post-Graduation Work Permit (PGWP) upon graduation.

ON-CAMPUS RESIDENCE

Humber provides residence for up to 1,450 students at our two campuses. Due to the limited availability of rooms and the highly competitive nature of the application process, we strongly encourage prospective students to apply early to be considered.

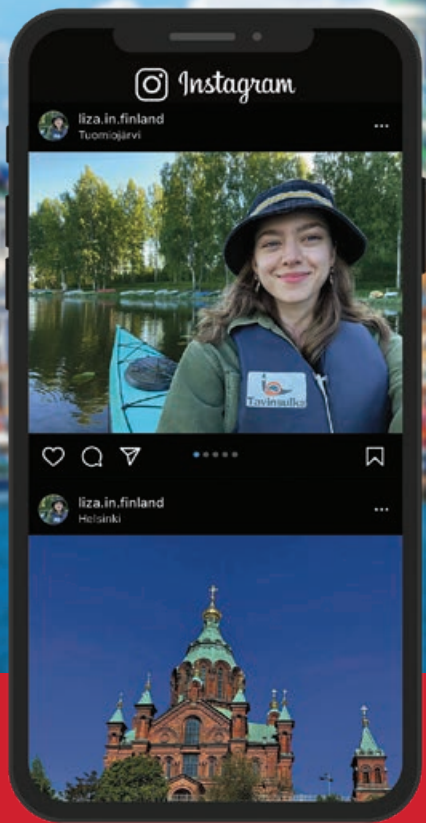

Funding Your Time in Canada

Students must have a very strong understanding of the cost of funding a Humber education in Canada. You need to have enough funds for your fees and living expenses, without support from elsewhere. Scholarships

INTERNATIONAL ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIPS

This 2024 entrance scholarship is available to new Diploma and Advanced Diploma students joining Humber each term. A total of 20 awards will be given to new students in fall, 15 awards in winter, and 5 scholarships will be awarded in summer; these students receive \$2,000 CAD off their tuition fees over the course of their first year of studies.

BACHELOR'S DEGREE SCHOLARSHIPS

All students applying to a bachelor's degree program at Humber will be automatically considered for these scholarships. Bachelor's degree scholarships are available to non-transfer students only, coming directly from high school/secondary school. No scholarship application is required.

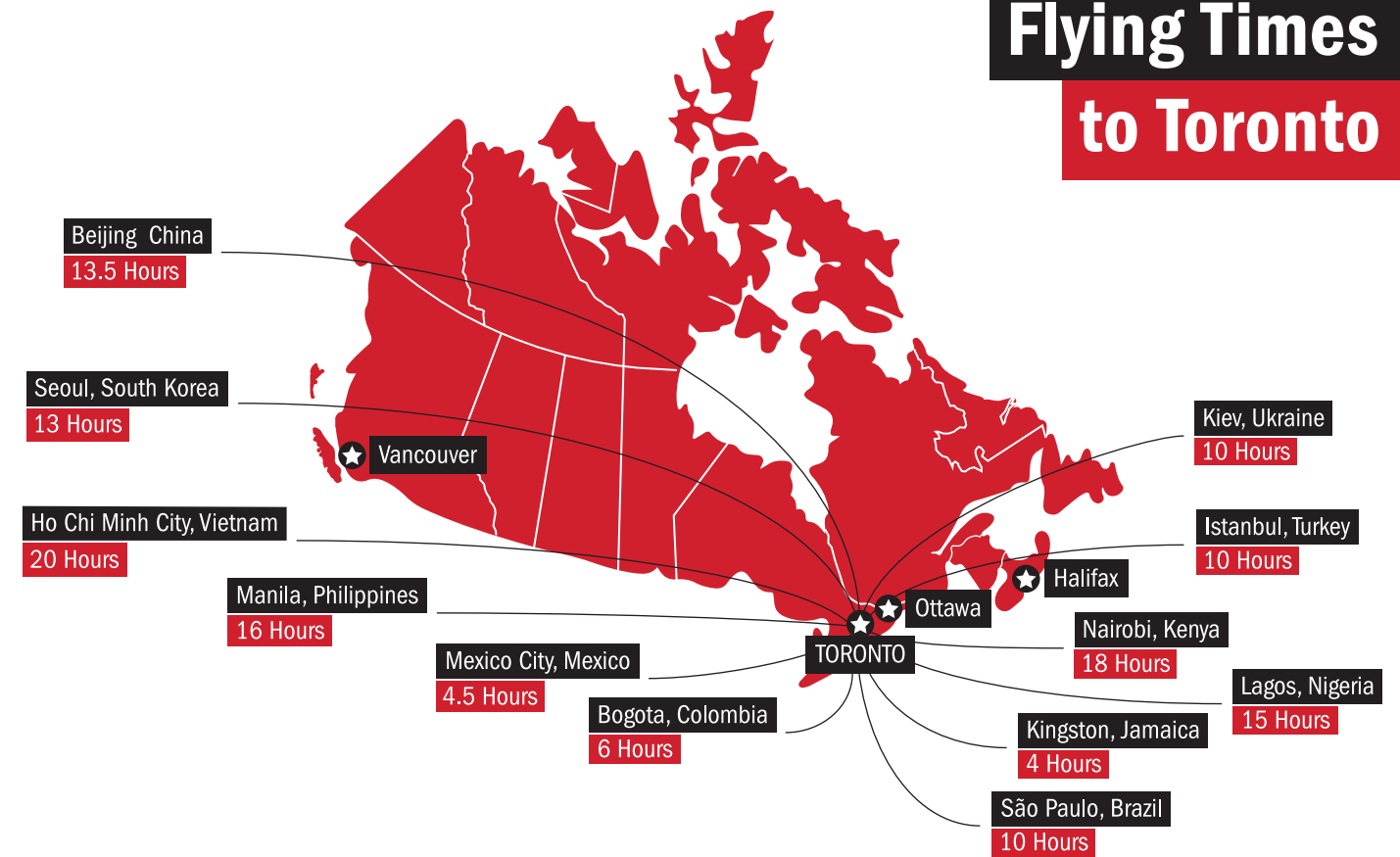

**Renewable scholarships will be reissued if the student achieves 80% or above in each year of the bachelor's degree.

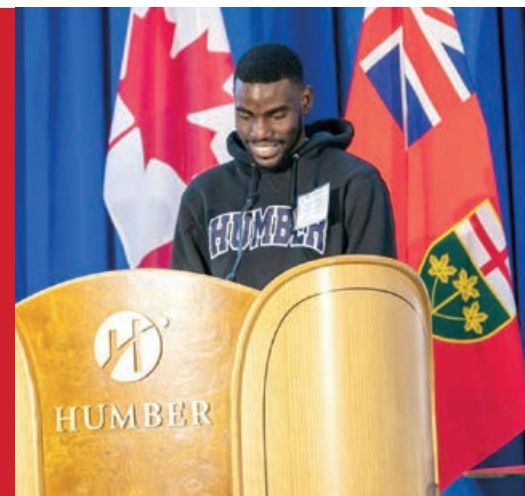
